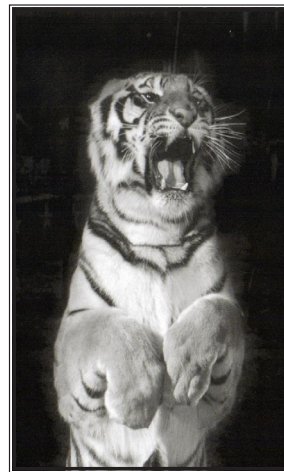
When asked about this award, he humbly replied, “I couldn’t have done it alone.” Congratulation Blake!

Under the Big Top

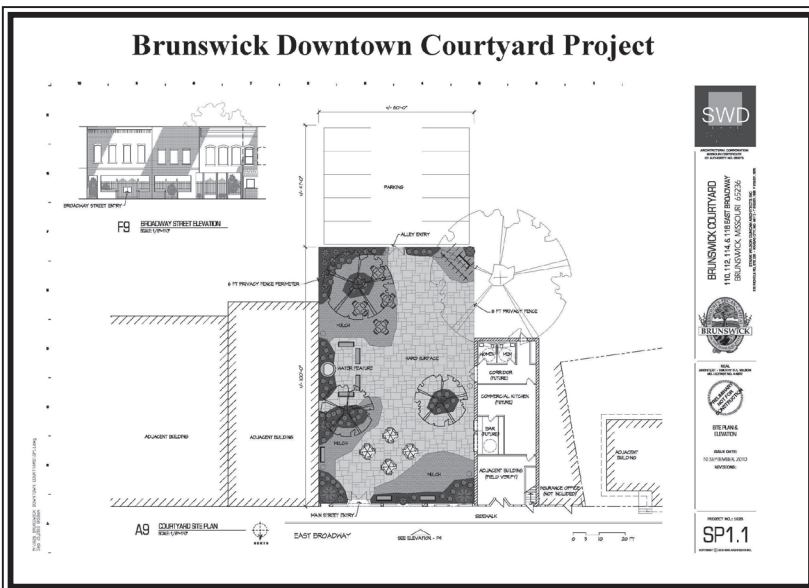
