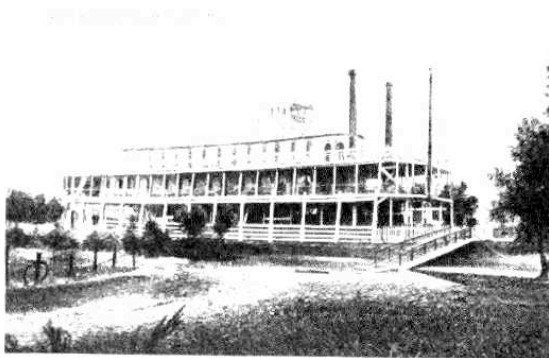

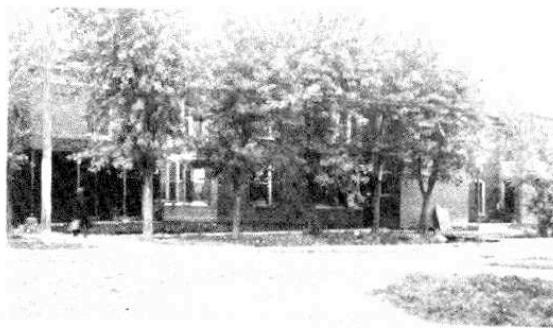

On the left is the picture of the Presbyterian Church Building which was razed prior to the building of the American Legion Memorial Home.
